










Migratory waterbird conservation has a long history

Resolution 1.6

AGREEMENTS

The Conference of the Parties to the Convention on the Conservation of Migratory Species of Wild Animals,

Recognizing the importance of demonstrating the effectiveness of the Convention,

Aware of the particular need to conclude Agreements for appendix II species,

- 1. <u>Instructs</u> the secretariat to take appropriate measures to develop Agreements for the following species and groups of migratory animals:
 - a. European species of Chiroptera;
 - b. Ciconia c. ciconia;
 - c. Western palearctic Anatidae;
 - North and Baltic Sea populations of <u>Phocoena phocoena</u> and <u>Tursiops</u> <u>truncatus</u>;
- 2. Recommends that process on these Agreements should be reviewed at meetings of the Standing Committee and Scientific Council, and reported on at the second meeting of the Conference of the Parties;
- 3. <u>Further recommends</u> that full account be taken of the record of discussions on the development of exemplary Agreements during the first meeting of the Conference of the Parties.

can you trust them in developing AEWA?







AEWA Map development


The development of the AEWA area in the period 1987 - 1995












Global flyways; the general picture














